Oshkosh holds a "Unity Walk" on Friday July 8th as a citywide response to the horrific Dallas shootings.

Chief Smith organized the Friday Unity Walk; he commented, "Last night when I was following the news coverage of what happened in Dallas, it struck me hard".

"Really it started out with the thought that I'm going to walk down the street, on Main Street and I'm going to talk to the people on the street and let them see the police department".

"We need to continue to build our relationships and remind our community that we all work together here. This is about community, it's about relationships and it's about just supporting each other".

Chief Smith said a positive, lasting relationship between the department and citizens it serves is crucial.

"It's not just about today, it's about a week from now and two weeks from now and a month from now and the relationships we continue to build and grow".

Considering there was only about a three hour notice before the event, hundreds of people turned out to participate in the Unity Walk. The incredible turnout shows the unity this community has with the department.
