When and where is it?

The event is at the Grand Opera House (100 High Avenue, Oshkosh) on October 5, 2012

What is it?

Go back in time to the 1920's and help solve a murder. The evening includes catered dinner, silent auction, 1920's costume contest and more! Prior to the event guests will be provided with a character name and description to play that night. Throughout the night guests will receive clues to help them figure out the murder. The evening will be interactive and costumes are encouraged but not required. There is a cash bar available at the speakeasy and during dinner. Water and coffee is included with your meal. The schedule for the night follows:

Is there anything special happening?

A silent auction and costume contest will be held in the Grand Lounge during the cocktail hour with the winners announced after dinner. There will also be prizes for tables that guess the murderer correctly.

How much are tickets and where can I get one?

Can I buy a whole table?

Yes, tables may be purchased <u>only</u> at the Grand Opera House Box Office. There are 9-6 person tables for a cost of \$450 and 3-4 person tables available for a cost of \$300. The total cost must be paid when purchasing the table and each person at the table must be included on a reply card. Please include the name of the person purchasing the table on the "Please seat me/us with..." line of the reply card.
