Subject: Strong Armed Robbery

The Oshkosh Police Department is investigating a strong armed robbery that occurred on Monday, October 7, 2013 at about 12:40 a.m. in the 1400 block of Oregon St.

An 18 year-old male from Oshkosh said that he was at the Kwik Trip Store at W. 20<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Oregon St. at about 12:20 a.m. and had purchased items and began walking north on Oregon St. after leaving the store. The 18 year-old said that he noticed three black males walking behind him on Oregon St. and he noticed these same three males were at the Kwik Trip while he was there.

The 18 year-old male said that as he approached W. 14<sup>th</sup> Ave, one of the black males ran passed the 18 year-old and went up a driveway. Shortly after, the 18 year-old male said he was punched in the back of the head and fell to the ground. The male suspects were hitting the 18 year-old and stole a cell phone and a wallet containing cash before leaving in an unknown direction. The 18 year-old male had injuries to his legs and head, but did not request medical attention.

Pictures of the suspects were taken from video at the Kwik Trip Store and are attached to this e-mail posting. One of the male suspects was wearing a black sweatshirt and a second suspect was wearing an orange and black Nike sweatshirt.
