Subject: Update on Robbery and Shooting

The Oshkosh Police Department was able to speak with the 47 year-old male victim of an armed robbery and shooting that occurred at about 12:05 AM on Wednesday, October 14, 2015 in the 600 block of N. Main St.

At the request of the victim and the victim's family, the name of the victim is not going to be released by the Oshkosh Police Department.

The victim recalled encountering the suspect after he exited behind the west side of the business in the 600 block of N. Main St. The victim was able to relay to Oshkosh Police investigators that it was a robbery that took place and property was taken before he was shot. The victim continues to recover at UW Hospital in Madison, WI.

No further information was obtained in regards to a suspect.

Oshkosh Police continue to ask citizens having information in regards to this incident; or if anyone in the area of the 600 block of N. Main St. has video cameras and may have captured video of the shooting to contact the Oshkosh Police Department at (920) 236-5700.

Oshkosh Police are asking citizens to remember personal safety when they are out at any location. Remember to park in a well-lit area at night; if possible, stay together with a group; if alone, walk in areas where there are many people it is well-lit and if you have a cell phone, call someone you know and talk with them until you get home; and report any suspicious persons or incidents.
