Wednesday-December 9, 2015

Domestic – 300 E. New York Ave.

A 52 year-old male from Oshkosh was arrested for domestic disorderly conduct in the 300 block of E. New York Ave. after he was involved in a domestic disturbance. He was taken to jail.

Disturbance – 500 S. Oakwood Rd.

A 51 year-old male from Oshkosh was arrested for disorderly conduct after he caused a disturbance at the hospital and damaged a door. He was taken to jail.

Retail Theft – 2500 block of S. Washburn St.

Five male subjects, all from Milwaukee, WI, were arrested in Washington County after they stole over \$650 in clothing from a store in the 2500 block of S. Washburn St. Four of the males, ages 24, 22, 21, and 18 were transported back to the Winnebago County Jail. A 14 year-old male was released to his mother. A theft was reported of a package that had been delivered onto the porch in the 600 block of W. Lincoln Ave. The investigation continues.

Assist Winnebago County Sheriff's Office Disturbance/Officer Involved Shooting – Witzel Ave. at Oakwood Rd.

A disturbance on CTH E in the Town of Algoma led to an officer involved shooting at Witzel Ave. and Oakwood Rd. A Winnebago County Deputy and Oshkosh Police Officer were involved in the incident, along with the suspect, Richard Klemz, 57 years old. Klemz rammed a squad car and a private vehicle in the Town of Algoma Hall parking lot before the shooting occurred. Klemz was taken to a local hospital where he is expected to survive his injuries. The WI Department of Justice Department of Criminal Investigation is investigating the incident.

Disturbance/Resisting – 100 block of High Ave.

A 28 year-old male from Oshkosh was arrested for resisting an officer and a warrant; and a 21 year-old female was arrested for obstructing an officer and a warrant in the 100 block of High Ave. after a 911 call came into dispatch where there was yelling and crying. The 28 year-old male attempted to evade officers who were making contact at the front door to an apartment. The 21 year-old female gave officers a false name. Both were taken to jail.
