#### **Domestic - First block of Chateau Terrace**

A 46 year-old male from Oshkosh was arrested for 4<sup>th</sup> offense OWI after his vehicle caused a chain reaction crash at the intersection of Algoma Blvd. and W. Murdock Ave. The 46 year-olds vehicle struck another vehicle that was stopped at a red light southbound on Algoma Blvd. at W. Murdock Ave.; which caused the 2<sup>nd</sup> vehicle to propel forward and crash into a third vehicle that was stopped at the traffic light. The 46 year-old was taken to the hospital for a blood draw and released to a responsible adult. The two other driver's received minor injuries, but were not transported to the hospital.

## Hit and Run Crash/OWI 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense – W. 6<sup>th</sup> Ave. at Iowa St.
