The Oshkosh Police Department is releasing the following information found on the opposite side of this page pursuant to Wisconsin State Statute 301.45 and 301.46 (Act 440), which authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform the public of a sex offenders release when, at the discretion of the agency, the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense that requires registration with the local law enforcement agencies. Further, his/her previous criminal history places the offender in a classification level which reflects the potential to offend.

This sex offender has served the sentence imposed on him/her by the courts and has advised officials that he/she will be living in the location on the opposite side of this page. **THIS PERSON IS NOT WANTED BY THE POLICE AT THIS TIME. THIS NOTIFICATION IS NOT INTENDED TO INCREASE FEAR; RATHER, IT IS OUR BELIEF THAT AN INFORMED PUBLIC IS A SAFER PUBLIC.**

Sex offenders have always lived in our communities but it was not until the passage of Act 440 (which mandates sex offender registration) that law enforcement even knew where they were living. In many cases, law enforcement is now able to share that information with you. Citizen abuse of this information to threaten, intimidate or harass registered sex offenders will not be tolerated. Further, such abuse could potentially end law enforcements ability to do community notifications. We believe the only person who wins if community notification ends is the sex offender, since the sex offenders derive their power through secrecy.

The Oshkosh Police Department is available to help you set up a Neighborhood Watch and to provide you with useful information on personal safety. If you have information regarding current criminal activity of this or any other sex offender, please call the Oshkosh Police Department at (920) 236-5700. In the case of an emergency, call 911.

The offender was convicted of Exposing Genitals to a Child & Exposing Child to Harmful Materials. These cases were the result of the same 2007 incident where the registrant used a computer and internet chat rooms to engage in sharing sexually explicit images with a person he believed to be a 15 year old female. In 2009 the offender was convicted of 2nd Degree Sexual Assault of a Child. The offender allowed a 15 year old female acquaintance to reside with him and sexually assaulted her on multiple occasions.

SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS/REQUIREMENTS:

- (1) No unsupervised contact with minors; No taverns/bars/liquor stores; No contact with victim; Not to consume alcohol or drugs.
- (2) Face to face contact with Law Enforcement required;
- (3) Comply with standard sex offender rules.
- (4) Comply with requirements and Lifetime Registrant of the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registration Program.
- (5) Comply with requirements of Lifetime GPS.

Stahmann will be moving to 325 Broad Street in Oshkosh on Friday, October 21, 2016. He is on extended supervision until 12/14/2024.

As of 8/29/2016 there are 24,630 registered sex offenders in Wisconsin. Of those, 5901 are in prison. 5828 are on active probation, parole or extended supervision. 12631 are terminated from supervision. There are 480 registered sex offenders reporting residence in Winnebago County.
