

City of Oshkosh Police Department SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION BULLETIN AUTHORIZED BY: CHIEF DEAN M. SMITH DECEMBER 1, 2016 BULLETIN #: 2016-13

The Oshkosh Police Department is releasing the following information found on the opposite side of this page pursuant to Wisconsin State Statute 301.45 and 301.46 (Act 440), which authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform the public of a sex offenders release when, at the discretion of the agency, the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense that requires registration with the local law enforcement agencies. Further, his/her previous criminal history places the offender in a classification level which reflects the <u>potential</u> to offend.

This sex offender <u>has served</u> the sentence imposed on him/her by the courts and has advised officials that he/she will be living in the location on the opposite side of this page. <u>THIS</u> <u>PERSON IS NOT WANTED BY THE POLICE AT THIS TIME</u>. THIS NOTIFICATION IS NOT INTEDED TO INCREASE FEAR; RATHER, IT IS OUR BELIEF THAT AN INFORMED PUBLIC IS A SAFER PUBLIC.

Sex offenders have always lived in our communities but it was not until the passage of Act 440 (which mandates sex offender registration) that law enforcement even knew where they were living. In many cases, law enforcement is now able to share that information with you. Citizen abuse of this information to threaten, intimidate or harass registered sex offenders will not be tolerated. Further, such abuse could potentially end law enforcements ability to do community notifications. We believe the only person who wins if community notification ends is the sex offender, since the sex offenders derive their power through secrecy.

The Oshkosh Police Department is available to help you set up a Neighborhood Watch and to provide you with useful information on personal safety. If you have information regarding current criminal activity of this or any other sex offender, please call the Oshkosh Police Department at (920) 236-5700. In the case of an emergency, call 911.

The offender was convicted in 1993 for sexually assaulting two minor females known to him.

SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS/REQUIREMENTS:

- (1) No unsupervised contact with minors; No taverns/bars/liquor stores; No contact with victim; Not to consume alcohol or drugs.
- (2) Face to face contact with Law Enforcement required;
- (3) Comply with standard sex offender rules.
- (4) Comply with requirements and Lifetime Registrant of the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registration Program.
- (5) Comply with requirements of Lifetime GPS.

Lemmers has moved to the Town Motel, 215 Division Street, Room 53 in Oshkosh. He is on extended supervision until 4/29/2018.

As of 8/29/2016 there are 24,630 registered sex offenders in Wisconsin. Of those, 5901 are in prison. 5828 are on active probation, parole or extended supervision. 12631 are terminated from supervision. There are 480 registered sex offenders reporting residence in Winnebago County.
