



City of Oshkosh declares snow emergency

OSHKOSH, Wis. December, 16, 2016 – The City of Oshkosh has declared a snow emergency effective on Friday, December 16, 2016 at 9 p.m. The snow emergency will be in effect for all streets in the City of Oshkosh. Snow emergency restrictions will remain in effect until 12 a.m. on Sunday, December 18, 2016.

Snow emergency parking restrictions on city streets will be as follows: On Friday, December 16, 2016 beginning at 9 p.m., vehicles may park on the side of the street with even-numbered addresses. This will be in effect until 12 p.m. (noon) on Saturday, December 17.

On Saturday at noon, vehicles will be required to park on the side of the street with odd-numbered addresses. This will remain in effect until 12 a.m. on Sunday, December 18, when it is anticipated that the snow emergency will be lifted. “No Parking” restrictions remain in effect for all vehicles between 2 a.m. – 5 a.m.

The City of Oshkosh Public Works Department requests your cooperation during this snow emergency, and strongly encourages motorists to avoid parking on city streets at all. This would assist the plows greatly as they clear the streets. Vehicles that do not comply with the snow emergency parking restrictions may be ticketed or towed.

This snow emergency is subject to change based upon weather conditions. Please be alert for further updates and weather announcements.
