Subject: Bullet Fired Into Home Update

The Oshkosh Police Department continues to investigate an incident involving a bullet that was fired into a home and vehicle in the 900 block of Sunnyview Rd. On Friday, June 2, 2017 at 2:30 AM Officers responded to a report of possible gunshots at this location. Officers located bullet holes in a residence and vehicle. No one was injured.

On Wednesday, June 7, 2017 the Oshkosh Police Department Detectives, School Resource Officers and Vice and Narcotics Officers made multiple arrests regarding this incident.

A 35 year old male from Oshkosh was arrested for 1st degree recklessly endangering safety and felon in possession of a firearm.

A 27 year old female from Oshkosh was arrested for party to the crime of 1st degree recklessly endangering safety and criminal damage to property.

A 39 year old male from Oshkosh was arrested for party to the crime of 1st degree recklessly endangering safety and felon in possession of a firearm.

A 16 year old male from Oshkosh was arrested for party to the crime of 1st degree recklessly endangering safety.

A 16 year old male from Oshkosh was arrested for aiding a felon and obstructing an officer.

An 18 year old male from Oshkosh was referred on a charge of obstructing an officer to the District Attorney's Office.

Both 16 year old subjects were taken to juvenile secure detention centers and the other adult subjects were taken to the Winnebago County Jail.

The suspected firearm used in the incident was recovered.
