Subject:	Accident, Car vs Train on Washington Avenue (Update 2)

The Oshkosh Police Department is continuing to investigate the accident involving a car verses a train that occurred on Washington Avenue at Broad Street on 12/22/2017 at 11:19PM.

The District Attorney's Office filed criminal charges today against Shawn L. Schettle. These charges are as follows: Count 1: Homicide by intoxicated use of a vehicle while having prior intoxicant-related conviction/revocation, Count 2: Homicide by intoxicated use of a vehicle while having prior intoxicant-related conviction/revocation, Count 3: Hit and Run-Resulting in Death, Count 4: Hit and Run-Resulting in Death, Count 5: Knowingly Operate Motor Vehicle While Suspended-Cause Death, Count 6: Knowingly Operate Motor Vehicle While Suspended-Cause Death.

Upon investigation, officers discovered that Schettle and one of the deceased females and the dog had left a residence in the 600 block of Boyd Street in the City of Oshkosh. A short while later, the vehicle was involved in an accident with a train on Washington Avenue at Broad St. Witnesses described a male fitting Schettle's description fleeing the scene after the accident. Officers ultimately located Schettle returning to a residence in the 700 Block of Bowen Street.
