Subject: Large seizure of drugs, several arrests (300 Block Broad St)

On 1/2/2018 Investigators from the Oshkosh Police Department Vice and Narcotics Unit conducted an investigation in the 300 block of Broad St. Investigators seized approximately 256 grams of Crystal Methamphetamine, 6.7 grams of Heroin, ten doses of Oxycodone, 19 doses of MDMA, Marijuana, Butane Hash Oil, Cocaine, Schedule II Prescription Drugs, Schedule IV Prescription Drugs, Psilocybin Mushrooms and suspected LSD.

As a result of the investigation, seven individuals were arrested/referred to the District Attorney for charges.

A 37 year old male was taken into custody for Possession with Intent to Deliver Methamphetamine 200-400 grams, Possession with Intent to Deliver Heroin 3-10 grams, Possession with Intent to Deliver MDMA 3-10 grams, Possession of Cocaine, Possession of a Narcotic Drug, Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Felon in Possession of a Firearm and Felon in Possession of Pepper Spray.

A 30 year old female was taken into custody for Maintaining a Drug Dwelling, Felony Bail Jumping, Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

A 35 year old male was taken into custody for a Probation Violation, Possession with Intent to Deliver Methamphetamine, Possession of Psilocybin Mushrooms, Possession of Cocaine and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

A 25 year old female was taken into custody for Possession with Intent to Deliver Methamphetamine and Possession of a Schedule IV Prescription Drug.

A 32 year old female was taken into custody on a Probation Violation.

Two other individuals are being referred on drug related charges.

The Oshkosh Police Department continues to work diligently to keep our community safe.
