Subject: UPDATE 2- Death Investigation- Broad St

UPDATE:

On 10/17/2018, Oshkosh police officers arrested a 34 year old male from Kaukauna for Aggravated Battery. The investigation is still on going.

Detectives from the Oshkosh Police Department's Criminal Investigation Division are continuing to investigate the death of a 47 year old Oshkosh resident. This individual has been identified as Steven Mallas.

Steven Mallas died at his residence on Broad St on Friday October 12, 2018.

According to the Milwaukee County Medical Examiner's Office, Steven Mallas died as a result of complications from a battery that occurred on 10/07/2018 at approximately 1:58 AM in the 400 Block of Boyd St in the City of Oshkosh. This battery was reported to have occurred on the sidewalk area of Boyd St. No weapons were reported being used during this battery. It is believed that this was an isolated incident and the public is not at risk.

The Oshkosh Police Department is currently investigating a death that occurred on Friday, October 12, 2018 on Broad St near Ceape Ave, in the City of Oshkosh.

An autopsy was completed on 10/15/2018 by the Milwaukee County Medical Examiner's Office. This investigation is still on going. More information will be released as the investigation continues.
