CIVIL DEFENSE AROUND THE STATE - what your neighbors are doing - - -

BELOIT - Freedom Week was observed in this city May 1 through May 6 to celebrate its 125th anniversary. Major events were a parade in downtown Beloit, talks by prominent members of the armed forces, and presentation of awards for the best essays and posters depicting the American way of life. The importance of civil defense in preserving our heritage was stressed by Fire Capt. Herb Christiansen, Beloit's new CD director.

OSHKOSH - The Oshkosh CD auxiliary police will publish a monthly bulletin on civil defense activities in this area. The first issue will be distributed May 13 to 70 members of the police unit and 10 other interested groups. The publication is a single sheet, twopage report temporarily bearing the name "CD News." Suggested names for the new bulletin have been requested. In announcing the new publication, Police Chief Harry A. Guenther congratulated auxiliary police members for their fine service in the past and their valuable contribution to the civil defense effort.

LANCASTER - Clair Boughton of Boscobel was named the new Grant county CD director at a joint meeting of the Law Enforcement and Civil Defense Committees held May 11. Boughton, a part time police officer, was also appointed as highway patrol officer. He replaces Charles Pritchett, Bloomington, who recently resigned from the CD director's post.

RICE LAKE – At the May 3 meeting of the Barron county Civil Defense Committee, emphasis was given to the need for a strong educational program to overcome public apathy in this area. Suggested means to accomplish this program included coordination of educational activities by local heads of government in order to implement CD programs in schools and civic organizations. Ray Roberge of Rice Lake was named as chairman of the committee responsible for getting the program underway. LA CROSSE - La Crosse county civil defense members approved a \$600 expenditure for the purchase of auxiliary police uniforms and caps. The county board had previously authorized \$500 for this purpose. The new uniform will consist of a light blue jacket with a red, white and blue CD insignia on the upper left sleeve and a division designation on the front left side of the jacket. The cap is of a light ivory colored washable plastic complete with earflaps. Each CD member will spend \$2 of his own money toward the jacket and cap and will provide his own navy blue trousers, white shirt, black shoes and necktie to complete the outfit.

VIROQUA - New facilities for the storage of CD equipment were recently granted by the Common Council at the request of Clarence Kilmer, CD director. Kilmer said the additional room was needed because of the expansion of CD activities during the past year. He said there were 40 trained auxiliary police at present with basic rescue training scheduled for the group in the near future. Other new personnel will also be trained, he said. In addition, he said there were eleven trained radiological monitors in the community.



GREENDALE – Harold P. Bruett, Greendale Chief of Police, resigned as civil defense director of this community effective June 1. Bruett said he was unable to devote the necessary time to the position be cause of his regular duties. Bruett recommended that a full-time CD director be appointed over the four communities of Greendale, Franklin, Hales Corners, and Greenfield which are part of a defense sector. Village President John T. La Rocca said he felt there was much merit in Bruett's suggestion for consolidation of the four communities into one organization with one CD director in command.
