Our details at Millers Bay each February have become a significant part of our yearly events. Thanks to everyone that volunteered to work these events.

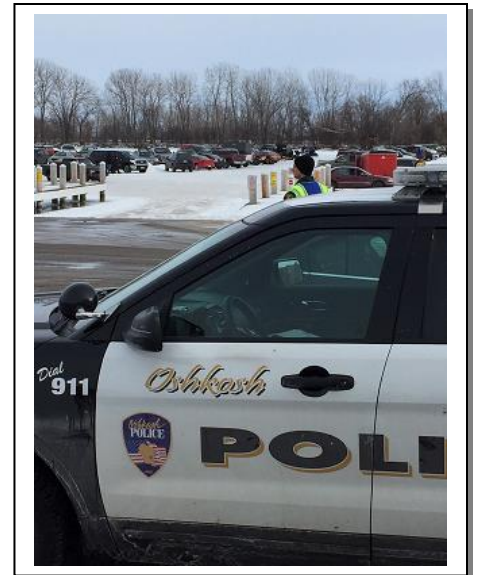
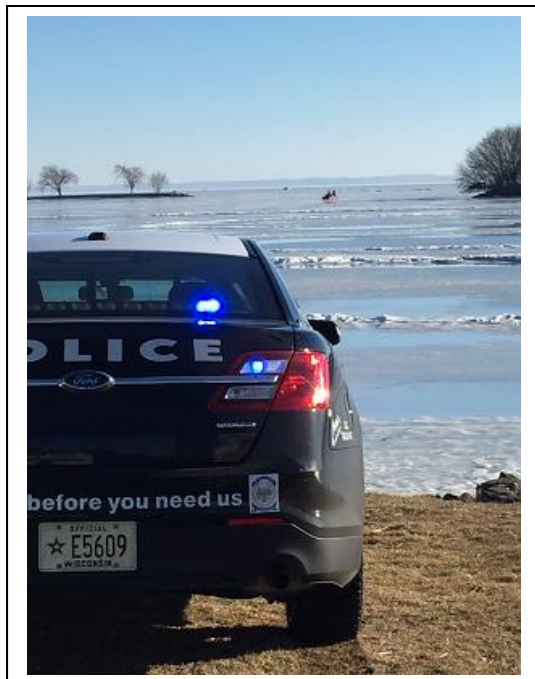
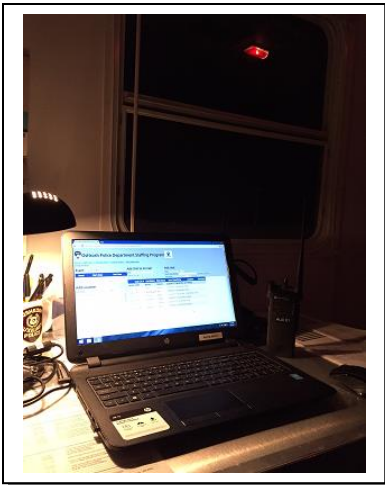

Call-out:

The evening of Saturday February 25th, after finishing the last shift of the Battle-on-Bago detail, we received a call from OPD Lt. Leckner. Someone had crashed into the main control box for the traffic signals at the corner of New York and Jackson. This had occurred earlier in the afternoon and City Electrical Department was in the process of repairing the electrical connections. The repair was taking longer than originally anticipated so our Unit was requested to assist with lights and traffic direction until the traffic signals were functional again.

We were told to expect about four hours to complete the project. As it was a cold night and we'd need to rotate Officers, four APO's were needed for the detail.

No sooner than we had received response and had our APO's on the way, the Electrical Department was able to get the lights temporarily repaired and on flash for the evening.
