Subject: Stabbing

The Oshkosh Police Department is investigating two related stabbings of individuals that occurred October 24<sup>th</sup> at approximately 11:00 p.m. in the 400 block of West Lincoln Avenue and 700 block of Wright Street. We are actively looking for a lone, white male suspect described as 5'9" to 6'0" tall weighing approximately 250 pounds with a buzz haircut and wearing dark, baggy clothing in connection with both stabbings.

A 911 call of a robbery was initially received at 10:58 p.m. The two male victims were walking in the 400 block of West Lincoln Avenue when the first victim was confronted by the suspect who forcibly took his cell phone. A struggle ensued and the suspect stabbed the first victim. The second victim gave chase into the 700 block of Wright Street where another struggle ensued and the second victim was stabbed. The suspect fled on foot westbound from the 700 block of Wright Street and has not yet been identified or apprehended. Both victims were transported to a local hospital with serious injuries. Further details of their condition are not being released at this time.

The Oshkosh Police Department is investigating whether this incident may be connected with other recent robberies that have occurred in the UW-Oshkosh area.
