Subject: Stolen Vehicle Suspects

The Oshkosh Police Department is investigating a stolen vehicle from a parking lot near Interstate 41 and W. 9th Av. in Oshkosh on March 8, 2016. A witness saw the man and woman steal the red Cadillac. Investigators also obtained video of the suspects in the area of the crime. The vehicle has been recovered in Milwaukee but police are still looking for the suspects.

A woman parked her 2002 red Cadillac in the Kwik Trip parking lot on March 8, 2016 around 6:45PM. She left her vehicle running while she went into the store. A man got in the driver's seat and a woman got in the passenger seat of the car and drove it away without the owner's permission. The car was located the next day in Milwaukee and returned to the owner.

Suspect #1 Description: Black Male Short dreadlock style hair Wearing a black hoodie with the hood up Dark blue jean pants Red colored shoes.

Suspect #2 Description: White Female Wearing a white and gray jacket style sweater Long light brown or blond hair Blue jeans.
