Subject: UPDATE: Incident at North High School

The Oshkosh Police Department has completed its investigation into the possible threat reported yesterday at Oshkosh North High School. In an abundance of caution, the school had temporarily been placed in lockdown until the juvenile in question was located. After the juvenile was detained and all facts of the incident were determined, it was established that the juvenile posed no threat to the school and at no time was there a weapon involved in yesterday's incident.

On 10/31/2018, the Oshkosh Police department received information from a school counselor of a North High School student that there had been an incident that had occurred in the Town of Oshkosh, Winnebago County. This incident involved the North High School student and a firearm.

The Oshkosh Police department advised the parent to report this incident to the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department.

OPD was advised on 11/01/2018 that this student had entered onto the North High School grounds, that the parent did not notify the Sheriff's Department about the previous incident and that a firearm may possibly be missing from the student's residence.

The Oshkosh Police Department advised North High School of the situation at approximately 9:20 AM, and as a precautionary measure, the school was placed in a hard lockdown.

The student was located off of school grounds by the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department. There is no danger to the public and no one was injured.

At approximately 10:15 AM, the Oshkosh Police Department advised North High school that the situation was resolved and the hard lockdown was lifted.

The Oshkosh Police Department and the Oshkosh Area School District continue to work diligently to ensure that our children are safe.
